Purpose: This bill clarifies the roles of the attorney general and the guardian ad litem regarding the termination of parental rights when a child is in the custody of the Division of Child and Family Services; clarifies the right to appointed counsel when an indigent parent's parental rights may be terminated in a private action; requires the state to pay the cost for appointed counsel when an indigent parent's parental rights may be terminated in a private action; requires that a parent whose parental rights may be terminated in a private action be given notice of the right to appointed counsel if the court determines that the parent is indigent; and makes technical changes.
